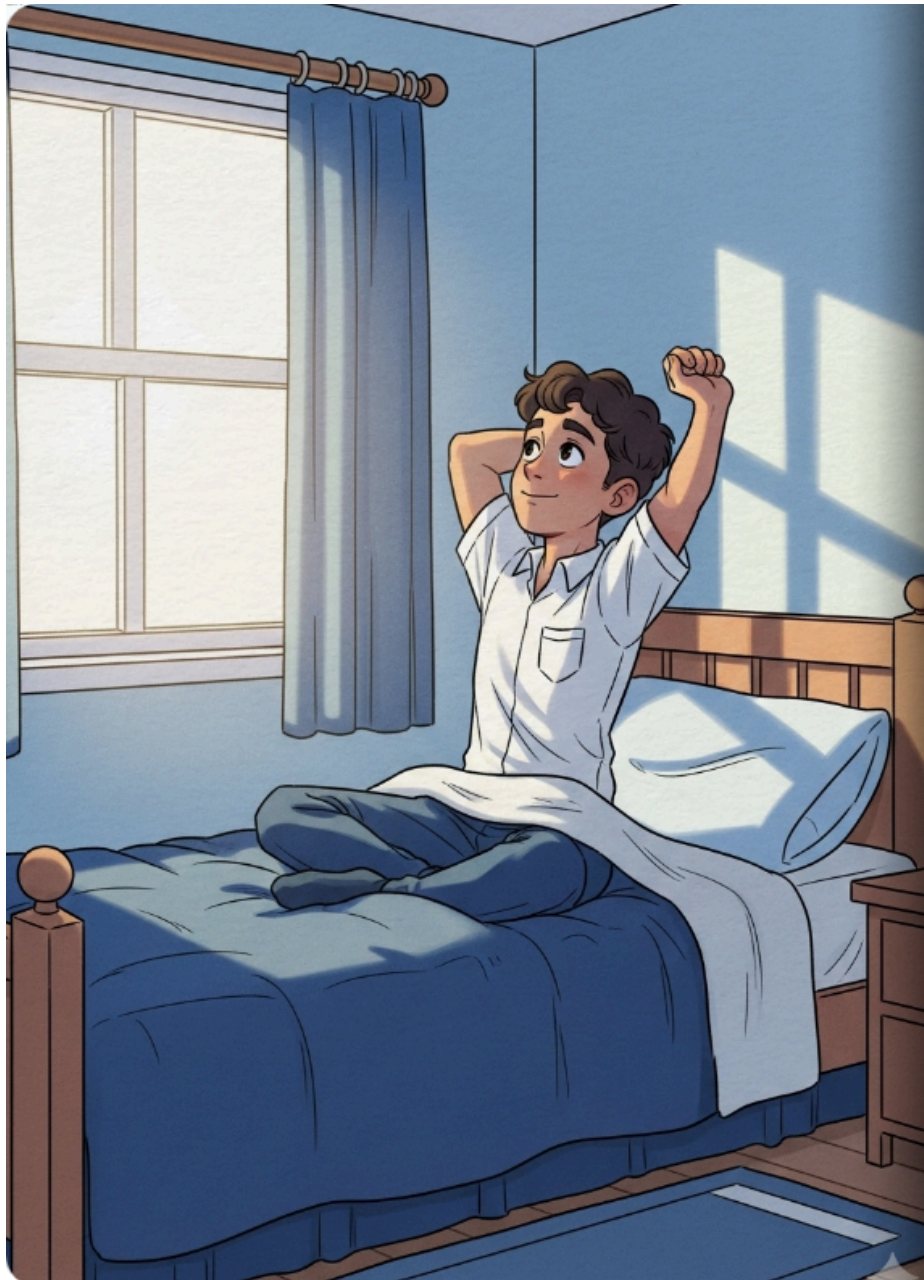




Paulo's Day
